

Health Ray Suit Asks \$28,000

Affairs of Beam Ray Inc., manufacturers of a health ray machine, were thrown into superior court again yesterday with the filing of a suit for \$28,000 damages by three London, England, residents who said they purchased the English manufacturing rights to the machine.

A former director of the company recently sought to throw the firm into receivership by a court action here, but lost the case a few weeks ago.

In the new suit, William V. Blewett, B. W. Gonin and Howard F. Parsons, all of London, charged they purchased one of the company's machines last June and at the same time purchased the British rights. They said they were led to believe they were being given one of the machines at cost when they paid \$2991 for it, but later discovered that it cost only \$300 to build.

They charged that the apparatus was not what it was represented to be and that the local firm had failed to disclose secrets of its design and that they were unable to make it do what it was supposed to.
